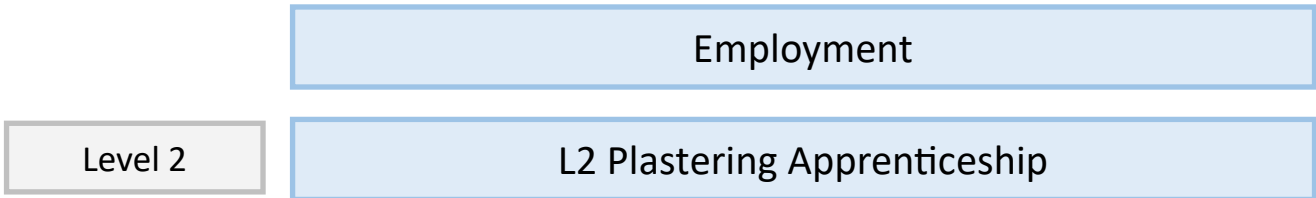




Progression Routes for Apprentices in:

With experience you could move to a supervisory job, or into related areas like tiling, dry lining, estimating and site management.

You could also become self-employed and work as a sub-contractor.

If you are studying any of the above Level 2 apprenticeships, your natural progression would be to go into employment.

If you find you do not have the **Level 3** entry requirements to go to university, you could study a Bridging course with LCB to increase your UCAS points and/or enhance your CV.

Remember, you do not have to go on to study higher education straight away, you can go into employment and consider HE at a later point in your life, if and when you want to open up your career options.
