Level 2	L2 Roofing Apprenticeship

With experience you could become a roofing surveyor, estimating costs, dealing with contracts and working with architects. You could also be a site manager, move into equipment sales or work as a steeplejack.

With a lot of experience, you could train apprentices, set up your own business or specialise in heritage conservation work.

If you are studying any of the above Level 2 apprenticeships, your natural progression would be to go into employment.

If you find you do not have the **Level 3** entry requirements to go to university, you could study a Bridging course with LCB to increase your UCAS points and/or enhance your CV.

Remember, you do not have to go on to study higher education straight away, you can go into employment and consider HE at a later point in your life, if and when you want to open up your career options.
